



Center Plymouth Plank Road

FRALICK'S ADDITION TO THE VILLAGE OF PLYMOUTH



PLYMOUTH PLANK ROAD

The land comprised in the accompanying plat including the streets therein of Fralick's Addition to the Village of Plymouth, County of Wayne and State of Michigan, is described as follows, viz: Commencing at the south west corner of a piece of land divided by Alfred B. Coleman and wife, to Henry Fralick on the 24th day of August, A.D. 1868, situated on section 26 in the Town of Plymouth, County of Wayne and State of Michigan, thence running south 46° East, parallel with Sutton Street, so-called, and on the south line of said land, so divided, 2 chains and 43 links to the north east corner of a piece of land owned by the Estate of George Bennett, thence south 44 1/2° West, along the east line of said Bennett land, about 4 chains and 55 links to the north side of Sutton Street, thence south 46° East along north side of Sutton Street 50 links to the south west line of land owned by Washington Bennett, thence north 44 1/2° East on said Washington Bennett's north west line about 4 chains and fifty five links to a stake at the north west corner of said Washington Bennett land, and on the south west line of the land so divided by said Coleman to said Fralick, thence south 46° East on said Fralick's south west line about 3 chains 84 1/2 links to the north west line of land owned by Thomas P. May, thence north 34 1/2° East along said May's western boundary line 7 chains 50 links to lands belonging to Simon W. Kellogg, thence north 46° West along said Kellogg's north western boundary line 3 chains and 70 links to a stake at the south east corner of a piece of land sold by John Kellogg and wife to said Henry Fralick and conveyed by deed dated August 17, 1854, and recorded in the Register's office of said Wayne County in Liber 55 of Deeds pages 485 + 486, thence north 34 1/2° East along said Simon W. Kellogg's north western boundary line about 11 chains and 70 links to the quarter section line of said section 26, thence north 37° West 4 chains and 81 links to south east side of Plymouth Plank Road, thence south westerly along the south side of said Road, 75 links, thence south 37° East 4 chains + 33 links to said quarter line, thence westerly along said quarter line to a stake on the north west corner of the lands so divided by said John Kellogg and wife to said Fralick, August 17, 1854, thence, as aforesaid, to said Fralick, to the place of beginning; also the following described piece of land commencing at the intersection of the line of Dodge Street with the west line of the lands so divided by said Coleman and wife to said Fralick, thence south westerly on said west line to the north line of lands heretofore owned by said Fralick and wife to Herard Newman, thence north westerly on said Newman's north line 50 links to the north east corner of lands heretofore owned by said Fralick and wife to John Polly, north line 50 links thence south westerly parallel with the north east corner of lands now owned by A. Polly, thence south easterly parallel with said Polly's north line 50 links to the north east corner of lands now owned by A. Polly, thence south westerly along the north line of said lands, now owned by A. Polly, to the place of beginning.

Also a certain piece of land being a part of Dodge Street as described in said plat lying between lands now owned by William N. Wherry on the south and John W. Dodge on the north being a piece of land divided by John W. Dodge and wife to the said Fralick, by deed dated April 28, 1870. Said land so divided by said John W. Dodge and wife to said Fralick, August 17, 1854, extending north easterly in said plat, commencing at the south east corner of the lot above so being a strip of land about 3 rods in width and 45 rods in length by the same more or less; the description of Union Street in said plat is as follows, viz: Commencing on the north side of said Sutton Street between the land owned by the Estate of George Bennett on the west and by Washington Bennett on the east, running thence north 44 1/2° East 7 Rods in width 4 chains and 50 links to the north east line of said Washington Bennett land, thence 4 rods in width and running north about 36 1/2° East about 18 chains and 75 links to the quarter line of said Road, the west line of that part of Union Street herein described which is 4 rods in width is bounded on the north west side by a new post and board fence; for further description of Union Street see the annexed plat. The description of Dodge Street named in said plat is as follows, viz: Commencing on the south east side of said Plymouth Plank Road and embracing the strip of land lying between the lands owned by William N. Wherry and John W. Dodge about 25 feet in width by the same more or less and running a south easterly course between said Wherry and Dodge lands about 17 Rods more or less to the westerly line of land now owned by said Fralick, from thence to be 4 rods in width running to the west line of Union Street extending northerly from said Wherry north line a sufficient distance to make the 4 rods in width, said strip of land being the same which was divided by said John W. Dodge and wife to said Fralick by deed dated April 28, 1870. For further description of said Dodge Street see the annexed plat. The description of Roe Street named in said plat is as follows, viz: is 3 rods in width and extends from the east side of Union Street to the west line of Thomas P. May's land running in a southeasterly course from Union Street as shown in the annexed plat and is County of Wayne and State of Michigan, and contains about 9 acres of land and is divided into lots and streets with the lengths of the lots in feet and 100th parts in figures on the sides, and the width on the ends, and are numbered from 1 to 27 inclusive and the names of the streets are marked in letters and width in feet in figures:

Dedication Know all men by these presents that we the undersigned Henry Fralick and Jennette Fralick, his wife, of the City of Grand Rapids and State of Michigan and Simon W. Kellogg and Jennette Kellogg, his wife of the Town of Plymouth, Michigan, the Village of Plymouth aforesaid, to be known, recognizes and records as Fralick's Addition to the Village of Plymouth aforesaid, and that all the streets as therein described each for themselves and for each other so far as they are owners of said above described land so laid out into streets, do hereby dedicate the same to the use of the public, as and for public streets. Witness our hands and seals herewith affixed this 26th day of November, 1872.
