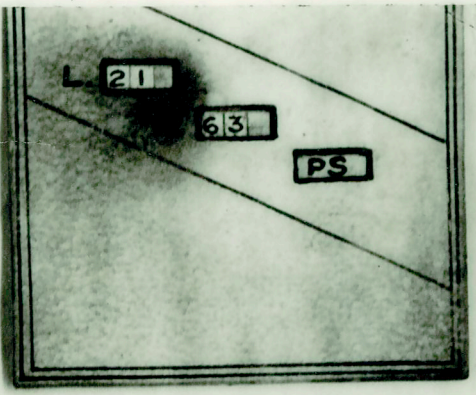

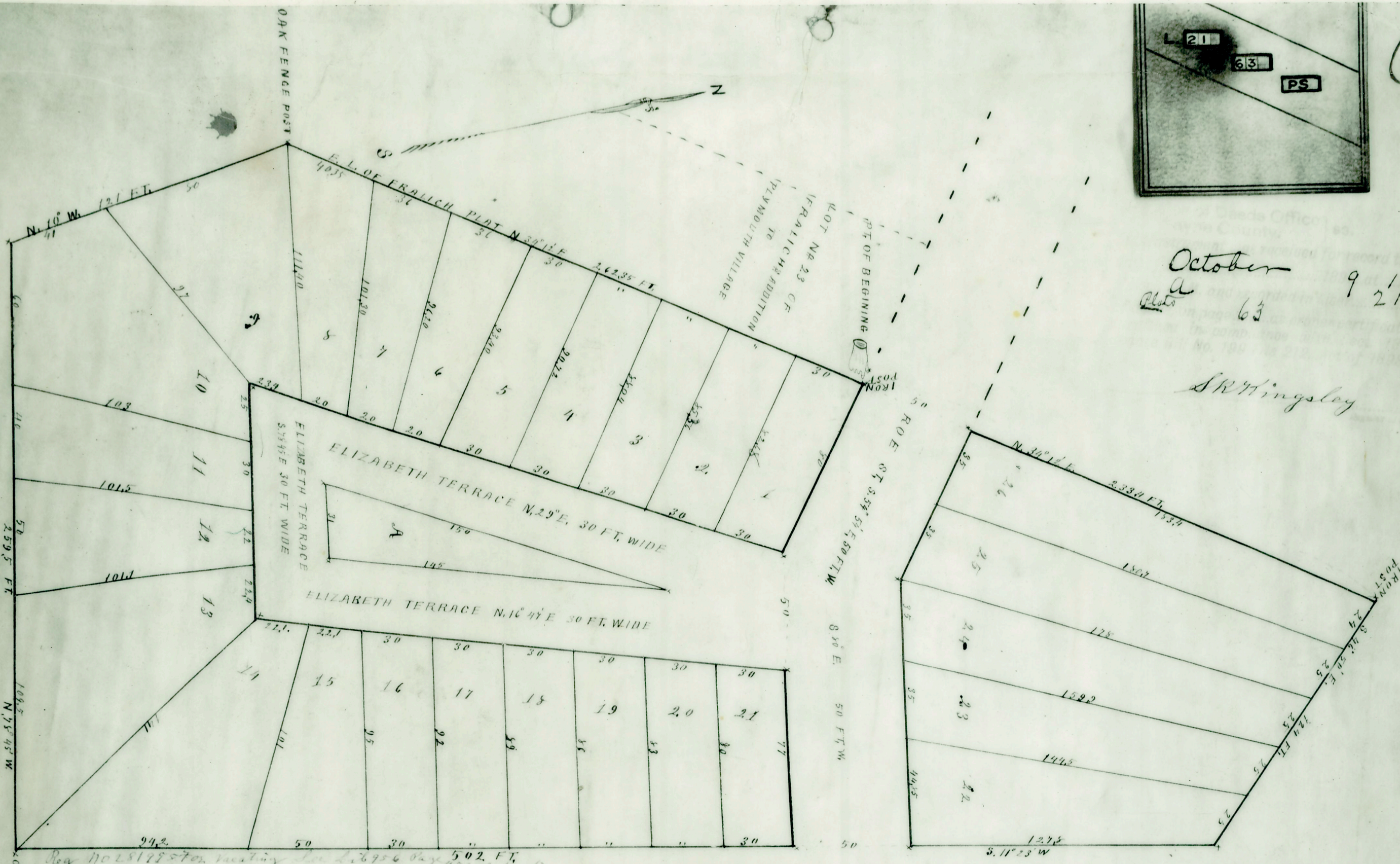

*Description of the land plat*  
The land embraced in the annexed plat of J. E. Penney addition to Plymouth Village is described as follows, beginning at an iron post at the N.E. corner of lot 34.23 of Tract's addition to Plymouth Village, thence along the E. line thereof S. 34° 12' E. 2330 feet to an iron post, thence S. 46° 58' E. 129 feet to a post, thence S. 11° 25' W. 502 feet to an oak fence post, thence S. 75° 45' W. 2575 feet to a post, thence S. 16° W. 121 feet to an oak fence post, thence S. 34° 12' E. 2223 feet to the point of beginning.

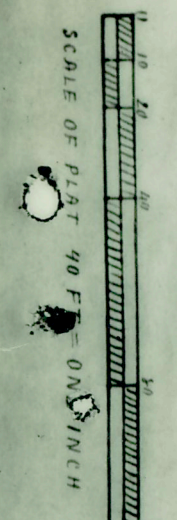
And all have by their Records that J. Penney & Penney as purchasers have caused the land embraced in the annexed plat to be surveyed laid out and plat to be known as T. P. Mann's addition to Plymouth Village, on S.W. 1/4 of Sec. 26 in T.18.S.E. Wayne County, Michigan, and that the State as then shown are hereby dedicated to the use of the public to be used as such and for no other purpose whatever signed and sealed in presence of
